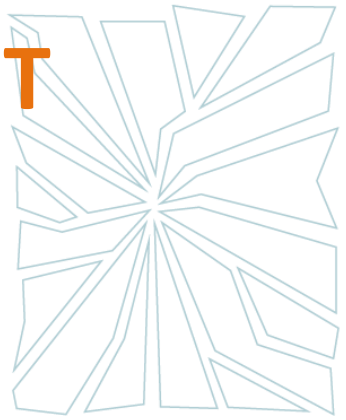

Lack of long-term funding and resources: long waiting lists

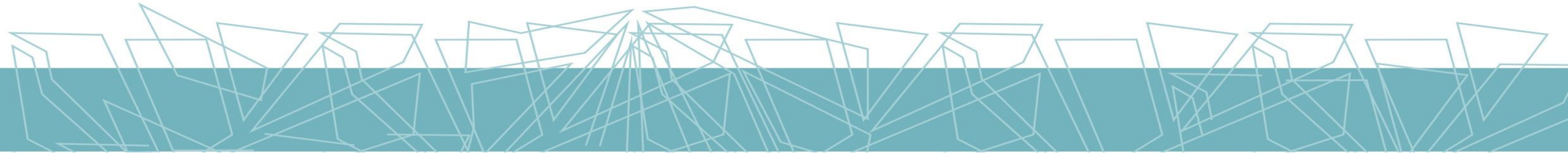
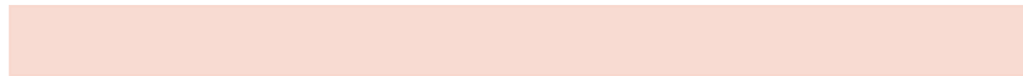
Equal services needed

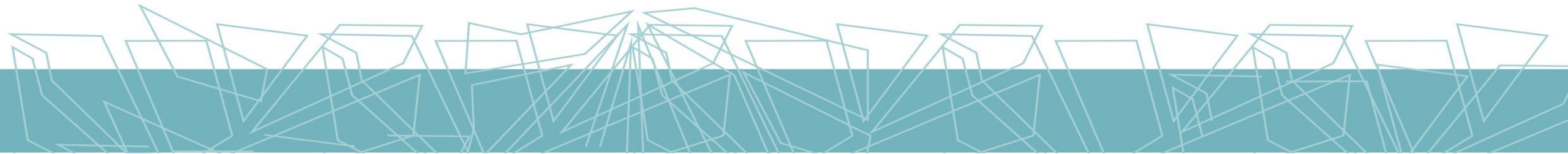

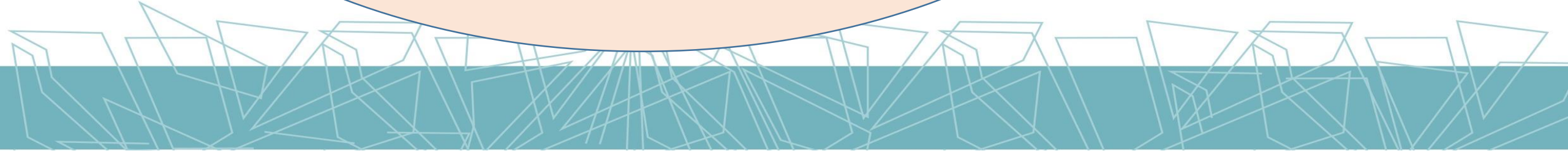

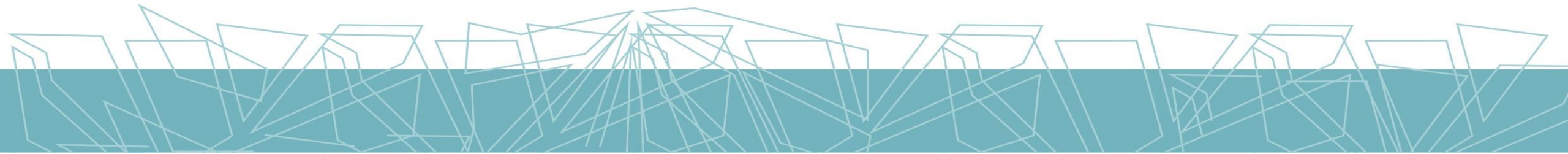
